Operation Lifesaver has six **MUST KNOW** tips for professional photographers considering a photo shoot near railroad tracks.

1. Trains can't stop quickly to avoid people or vehicles on the tracks.
2. An optical illusion makes it hard to determine a train's distance from you, and its speed.
3. The average train overhangs the track by at least three feet on either side.
4. Railroad tracks, trestles, yards, and rights of way are private property.
5. No tracks should be assumed to be abandoned and inactive.
6. People in your community, or who see your photos on Facebook or websites, mimic your behavior, putting them in danger.

PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHER'S PLEDGE

I understand that trespassing on railroad property is illegal and pledge that my photography business will never use railroad rights of way, tracks, or trestles for photo shoots. Should a customer ask for a location that is on railroad right of way, I will explain to them why I cannot do so, and will suggest alternatives.
